A Change of Heart This Easter Season

God says in Ezekiel 36:26-27a, "A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh," for, "I will put my spirit within you."

That is the promise of Easter for you. You can have a change of heart. Many parishioners got together to see the movie "A Case for Christ" on the Friday before Palm Sunday. We had over 120 people from this church fill a theater that night. The main character in the movie is a bitter man. He has been alienated from his father. He is jealous that his wife goes to church and worships Christ. He is angry and he drinks too much. He often finds himself sad and alone. And he decides to disprove the resurrection. In the end, his investigations lead him to believe in Christ, because of the historical evidence. But perhaps the greatest proof for him is that his wife continues to love him and pray for him, even when he treats her very badly.

And in the movie, the prayer she prays for him is this passage, that his "heart of stone might become a heart of flesh." And sure enough there is a moment when you can see it happen. He looks into the love of Jesus and finds new life and he receives a new heart from Christ.

That is what Jesus makes possible for you through his death and resurrection. On his cross Jesus took all the bitterness, all the alienation, all the anger and sadness upon himself. Isaiah 53:4-5 says it like this, "Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases... He was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed."

On Good Friday many of us literally wrote down our sins, our sadness and our sickness, and our griefs... on little pieces of paper. And those are the papers we used to start the new fire of Easter. Literally we took our hardened hearts and offered them at the cross in prayer. And the promise is that we can expect resurrection for our hearts.

Romans 6:5 says, "If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." And in baptism, when we pray over the water, the priest says, "We thank you Father for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection." The idea here is quite simple. If you believe in the power of the cross of Jesus Christ, then your dead heart can become alive again so that you receive a new resurrected and restored heart.

And so in this Easter season, I invite you to receive your new heart of flesh. Pray in this way:

Think of the cross of Jesus. Think perhaps of the Passion reading from Palm Sunday, or the Good Friday service you may have attended, or perhaps the Lent study when we focused on the crucifixion. Now make the sign of the cross on your chest. Take the cross of Jesus to yourself. Place your hand on your heart, and let the hand of God touch your heart.

Then I invite you to speak to God with this prayer, which is based on this Ezekiel reading:

Lord give me a new heart. Lord put a new spirit within me. Remove from me my heart of stone. Remove bitterness. Remove alienation. Remove jealousy. Remove anger. Remove sadness.

Lord give me a heart of flesh. Put your Spirit within me. Give me the Love of Jesus. Give me the resurrected Life of Jesus. Lord put your Spirit within me this Easter. Amen.

Remember throughout this Easter season that the resurrection of Jesus is meant to give you a change of heart. Turn your eyes upon Jesus and know that his resurrection is for your heart.

A short Course in Christian Living and Leadership

Cursillo starts with identifying those who are living an active Christian Life and witnessing to their love of Christ and who would welcome the support of Cursillo community and method. Is this you? Cursillo – Spanish for "Christian Living," not Christian Doctrine or theology.

Cursillo began in the 1940's as a Christian renewal movement within the Spanish Catholic Church, Cursillo de Cristiandad was born as a method that would provide an ongoing community of support and accountability to help individual Christians to live out the life that Jesus promised and to share the Gospel in their everyday environments. Its basis is a meeting of small groups of Cursillistas in Reunions to share their experiences and to assist the members of the group to stay on the path. Ultreya are Reunions of Reunion Groups and can be held at a local church, or at other churches in the area or on a Diocesan basis.

The Weekend, 2 or 3 days, is a time to focus on the fundamentals of being a Christian and to learn the Cursillo method. A group of Episcopalians gathers to share the richness of worship and to broaden each one's appreciation of Church. Planned and conducted by a team of Laity together with 2 or 3 members of the clergy who function as spiritual advisors, it consists of a series of 15 talks (Rollos) emphasizing the doctrine of Grace, The Sacraments, and the Cursillo foundation: Piety, Study, and Action. Eucharist is celebrated daily along with the daily offices, and time is provided for prayer, confession, meditations, and spiritual direction. And, of course, there is fellowship, singing and good food. There are not secrets, but there are some joyful surprises. The next Cursillo is the new 2-day weekend - 23-25 June 2017 and the COED weekend #125 - 20-22 October 2017.

The 4th Day is the rest of your life, and is represents a lifetime of living out your Baptismal Covenant with the support of the Cursillo method and community.




