





### LENTEN SMALL GROUP STUDY

"I invite you, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance, by prayer, fasting and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." These familiar words are from our Ash Wednesday service. This year, Ash Wednesday is March 1. I hope that you will all be able to be present for one of our services so that together we may make a right beginning to this holy season.

Our special study program this year during Lent is called "24 Hours that Changed the World." We will be meeting in small groups in homes throughout the parish as well as in small groups at the church. There will be at least 12 groups. All the meeting times and locations are listed on the front page of the this newsletter. I hope that all of you will be able to participate in a group so that we may journey together toward Easter.

The program, "24 Hours that Changed the World," was created by Pastor Adam Hamilton, the author of the Advent study we used in December 2016. Like previous studies, there is a DVD and a companion book. I have prepared a customized discussion guide. The program will run for 5 weeks. Each group will begin after Ash Wednesday and conclude before Holy Week.

Drawing on insights from history, archaeology, geography, and the Bible, Pastor Adam Hamilton provides a deeper understanding of the most amazing day in history, starting with the Last Supper. During the video segments, which range from 12 to 19 minutes, we will visit the sites where those earth-shaking events took place, and we will walk where Jesus walked along the road that led to the pain and triumph of the cross.

The study is based around the account in the Gospel of Mark (chapters 14-16) beginning with the Last Supper, and continuing through the prayer in the garden, the arrest, the trial, the crucifixion and the resurrection. The aim of this study is to help us have reasonably accurate mental pictures of how these events took

place, to increase our understanding of the significance of Jesus suffering and death, to study related passages of Scripture, and most importantly to find our own personal connection to this incredible story of salvation.

If you have not already signed up to participate in a group, please check the list and find one that fits your schedule. You may sign up in the narthex at church or by calling the office. Books will also be available in the narthex and at the office (\$10 donation requested but not required).

Overview of the five sessions: (plan for each session to be 60-90 minutes long)

- Session 1: The Last Supper (chapter 1 in the book)
- Session 2: The Garden of Gethsemane, the trial before Caiaphas, Peter's denial of Jesus (chapters 2 and 3 in the book)
- Session 3: Jesus, Barabbas, and Pilate and the Torture and Humiliation of the King (chapters 4 and 5 in the book)
- Session 4: The Crucifixion (chapter 6 in the book)
- Session 5: Christ the Victor (chapter 7 in the book)

Please plan to bring your Bible with you to each session of the study. Each session will begin with an opening prayer, which comes from the Psalms, and is connected to the lesson for the day. At the end of the session, you will be invited to share your prayer requests with your group, lift those requests up to God and then close with the Lord's Prayer.

As we journey through these 24 hours that changed the world, may God change our hearts and make us new in Christ.

# Health Ministry News

#### Which Massage Therapy is Right for You?

With Massage Therapy a household word and most of us familiar with the profession and benefits, we might get confused with all the different modalities available. What is best for our needs? Here's a description of five well known massage techniques.

Swedish Massage: This system of bodywork is the core of all professional training. Performed in a full body format, the focus is the musculoskeletal system using an oil based lubricant. Pressure is from superficial to moderate, with the treatment lasting from 60 to 90 minutes. (Theory and Practice of Body Massage by Frank Nichols p113–114. © 1980, Milady Publishing Corp.)

Sports Massage: Focusing on pre and post treatment for athletics, Sports Massage has been shown to reduce muscle soreness and swelling, increase recovery time and rid the muscle of metabolic waste. A reduction in the rate of injury has also been reported. (Encyclopedia of Alternative Medicine, © 2005, the Gale Group, inc.)

Rolfing: Developed by Ida Rolf, PhD (1896–1979), she theorized that our bodies are intricate with earth's gravity. In a ten session series, functional improvement is achieved reducing the risk of wear and tear from structural imbalance. Some variations include Mysfascial Release, Connective Tissue Massage and Structural Integration. (Rolfing and the Physical Reality, Ida P. Rolf, PhD)

Medical Massage: Wickipedia describes this as "an outcome based treatment.....targeting specific problem(s) the patient presents within a diagnostic model. Treatment is planned after assessment and evaluation with specific goals is established." Not normally a full body treatment, this "hands on therapy" has roots in historic medical texts in both Eastern and Western medicine and has made a comeback in today's medicine.

Neuromuscular Therapy: A precise treatment of the body's soft tissue using regional, step by step protocols, some benefits include relief from ischemia (reduced blood flow to the muscle), nerve entrapment, and dysfunctional gait patterns. It is highly effective in reducing long standing pain, and is performed by a certified NMT therapist. (© 2015 NMT Center, all rights reserved)

Cost for treatment varies according to the degree of specialty, time involved and clinic rates. An experienced LMT should tailor the session to your needs. Always look for certifications and licensure. And most important, enjoy!


