COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS

Try a fun spiritual exercise this month. Sit down and make a list of 100 different ways that God has blessed you. At first you may find that you are writing furiously as ideas pop into your head. By the time you are more than halfway toward the goal you may find yourself slowing down, digging deeper into your past. As you approach 97-98-99 you will remember the smallest, sweetest blessings. Indeed, as you see what God has done in your life, your heart will be full.

I read a story about a family that lost nearly everything they had – their family business, their house, their savings. The creditors hounded them as bills went unpaid. They had to rely on family and friends for basic needs like food and clothing. From the outside it seemed like they hit bottom. But in reality they had lost everything but the one thing that mattered most – the hope and faith that God had placed in their hearts. Sometime later, the husband was asked to speak to a men's group. Someone asked him what their secret was to making it through this difficult time. He said there really was no secret. They had just made a simple choice to wake up each day and be grateful. No matter what happened, they were confident that God would be with them and so they chose to notice even the smallest blessings and give thanks.

Reading that story reminded me of a woman we met in Nigeria. She had planted a field of corn and as soon as the corn was ready to harvest she took the first nice ears and carefully placed them in a basket. She put on her best clothes, set the basket on her head, and walked to the church for the Sunday worship service. At church she gracefully processed down the aisle to present her offering, the first corn from her field, at the altar. As she counted her ears of corn she was counting all of her blessings and giving thanks to God as she gave back a portion of what God had given her.

Someone once said, "Hem your blessings with thankfulness so they don't unravel." It's important to stop and pay attention to what God is doing in our lives and equally important give thanks to God for each blessing. Doing so is a daily choice – one that will fill your life with joy for three simple reasons. First, counting our blessings gives us the chance to re-live the experience. Just feel the smile coming to your face as you remember a time that God was specially present with you. Second, gratitude builds on itself. The more we practice giving thanks for how God is blessing us, the easier it will be to spot those blessings in the midst of difficulty. Third, when we practice gratitude in our lives, it tends to rub off onto other people, blessing them as well. One moment of gratitude leads to another, and we are set free to praise God with our whole lives.

May God bless you abundantly!

St. Cuthbert Beer Brewing is BACK!



St. Cuthbert's had their first brew day on Saturday, September 18. We met in the Lewis Hall kitchen. There were about 10 in attendance. Each one who was present pitched in and participated.

Most showed up at the 9:00am. Two 5-gallon batches were made. One was a Porter which will become a Chocolate Cherry Coffee Porter when it is finished. The second was a Hefeweizen (Wheat Beer). At this time both are fermenting vigorously. The next step is to bottle it and to bottle condition (carbonate) it. The second brew day is in the works and will be set to brew in the near future. This will be a German Pilsner style beer which is a light, smooth beer.

Thanks to those brought bagels and meatballs. There was even a sample of Saison that Fr. Dave brewed. St. Cuthbert's is open to all and we encourage you bring a friend. Even if you cannot make a brew day there is still much to do on the days we bottle the batches.
