

From Your Health Ministry

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month, an annual campaign to raise awareness of breast cancer risks, the value of screening and early detection, and treatment options available to women and men who are diagnosed with one of the many forms of breast cancer. There is good news in the fight against breast cancer. Deaths from this disease continue to decline. Increased awareness and



the potential of earlier detection through screening (such as annual mammograms) have resulted in improved management of the disease at its earliest and most treatable stage. Mammography has tremendous potential to saves lives. Tell your mothers, sisters, daughters, and friends to schedule their annual mammograms today. If you're a woman of any age and are at high risk for developing breast cancer, talk to your doctor about when you should start genetic screening, mammograms and risk-reducing strategies, such as medications that may reduce your risk of developing breast cancer. Monthly breast self-exams are still a great weapon in the early detection of breast cancer.
