FROM THE CO-RECTORS

Dear Members and Friends of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church,

On Pentecost Sunday (June 5) we announced our intention to retire as Co-Rectors of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church. The Vestry had met in a special meeting on May 26 and approved an agreement whereby **our last Sunday will be August 7** and our last day in the office will be August 12. The Vestry also approved that we use the remainder of our vacation days during the month of August and that the months of September and October be considered terminal leave. In addition, the Vestry approved that we be able to stay in the rectory until the end of the year, if necessary, for our move. We are very grateful and **sincerely thank the Parish** for its generosity towards us.

Our decision to retire came after much thoughtful and prayerful discernment over several years. The actual decision happened when we were on retreat in North Carolina in March. Back in 2019 and 2020 we studied transition ministry through the Interim Ministry Network. What we learned has helped us to see that today Holy Trinity is in a good place to make a transition. Financially, the church is in great shape; there is no debt. The lay leadership is strong. The staff are knowledgeable, caring, and hard-working. Major projects have concluded.

We have now served 16 years at Holy Trinity. We are amazed at what God has done, as together we have all worked to live out the mission "to know Christ and to make Him known." Elsewhere in this newsletter is a list of metrics, but what matters to us more than any of the numbers, are the lives that we have seen transformed through the love of Jesus Christ. It has been a great privilege to share deeply in the lives of so many faithful Christian people.

We very much believe that God called us to serve at Holy Trinity, but now believe that God is releasing us from the responsibilities of serving as Co-Rectors. Quite simply, we have done what God called us to do in this Parish. We are very clear that our call to Christian ministry continues, but that the season of our work at Holy Trinity is concluding. We believe that now God is calling us to spend time with our family and to spend time together traveling and becoming as healthy and whole as possible.

For the past 16 years we have carefully studied the patterns and habits of Florida retirees ☺. We are grateful for the example so many parishioners have provided for how to retire well. We plan to follow your example enjoying God's creation and our family. After an appropriate season of rest and recreation, we expect that God *might call* us to another adventure in ministry, perhaps as interim priests somewhere, but for now we are looking forward to doing our best to simply enjoy life.

On a personal note, we have arrived at two milestones in our lives, 40 years of marriage and 30 years of ordination. We feel incredibly blessed that the Church Pension Fund makes it possible for clergy to retire after 30 years with full benefits, sufficient for a modest lifestyle. We have two small houses, one in Palm Bay and one in the mountains of North Carolina; they both need work, some of which we can do ourselves, but both are very comfortable. We look forward to splitting our time between Florida and North Carolina, and doing some kayaking, walking on the beach, and hiking in the mountains. Pam has lots of recipes to try, and Steve plans to go fishing. And, of course, there are many books we have been planning to read.

We are confident that Holy Trinity is well positioned for the future. We are very pleased to announce that the Vestry has voted to appoint Fr. Dave Newhart as Priest in Charge during the transition and Fr. Bob Bruckart as Associate Priest in Charge, until the call of a new Rector(s). These appointments have been approved by the Bishop.

Fr. Dave and Fr. Bob have already been working together on much planning for the next year. You can find information about that in this newsletter, but some of the activities will include a stewardship program grounded in the prayers of parishioners, a Wednesday morning healing prayer service, a Thursday Bible study, some creative worship changes for the Saturday 5 pm service, resuming "prayer teams" at the Sunday 9 am service, and Foyer Groups. Fr. Bob is also working on putting together an Alpha leaders training group for the Fall so that the Parish can launch Alpha in the Spring of 2023. (Alpha is a practical study of the Christian faith and an opportunity to *explore the meaning of life*).

In the next year, as the priests and deacons continue to lead the Parish in worship and teaching and pastoral care, the Vestry, and a yet to be formed Search Committee, will work to survey the congregation, write a parish profile, advertise for candidates, pray for God's will, and interview and call the next Rector(s). Be assured that Holy Trinity Episcopal Church has very strong leadership in many ministries and the ability to attract wonderful new clergy. And God is faithful!

Thank you for the opportunity to serve what we have always believed to be one of the very best Episcopal Churches in the whole country. Archbishop George Carey once wrote that what has the potential to unite us as Christians is:

- (1) Love of Jesus Christ,
- (2) An experience of salvation as something deeply personal and life-changing,
- (3) Love of the Scriptures as God's Word for us,
- (4) Worship in which teaching from the Bible is paramount,
- (5) And a deep desire for others to share the faith.

This is the legacy we have worked hard to leave at Holy Trinity. We are beyond grateful for the prayers and personal support we have received. Thank you in advance for all you will be called upon to do in the transition to new pastoral leadership. May God continue to bless Holy Trinity Episcopal Church+

Changes in Endowments from 2006 to 2022:

In **July of 2006** the Parish Endowment totaled: **\$338,305.**

Financial Well-Being:

The Church celebrated being **debt-free** (after paying off the last mortgage) on Pentecost Sunday, June 5, 2022.

Holy Trinity Episcopal Church has ended the year “in the black” with all expenses paid from the operating budget for 15 consecutive years beginning with 2007, thanks to generous parishioners!

Significant Outreach Expenditures:

In 2006, \$100,000 was sent from the Holy Trinity Episcopal Church Capital Campaign to Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy for capital projects at the Lower School.

As a result of the sale and re-capitalization of the Trinity Towers buildings, over \$20 million was invested in renovations in the three apartment buildings containing 510 government subsidized apartments for the low-income elderly.

On April 13, 2015, the sale also resulted in \$300,000 in community outreach grants to the following organizations: \$50,000 to Brevard Alzheimer’s Foundation, Inc.; \$150,000 to Shriners Hospitals for Children, Inc. (*This was split in the following way: \$75,000 to Shriners Hospitals for Children, Inc. and \$75,000 to Azan Shrine Transportation Fund*); \$20,000 to Community of Hope, Inc.; \$20,000 to The Episcopal Retreat and Conference Center, Diocese of Central Florida, Inc. (*This is the Canterbury Retreat Center*); \$20,000 to Devereux Florida, Inc.; \$20,000 to Holy Trinity Episcopal Academy, Inc.; \$4000 to His Place Ministries East Coast, Inc. (ministry with the homeless in downtown Melbourne); \$4000 to Nana’s Children’s Home, Inc.; \$4000 to Give a Little Hope, Inc.; \$4000 to Melbourne Municipal Band Association, Inc.; \$4000 to Literacy for Adults in Brevard, Inc.

In addition to these, Holy Trinity Episcopal Church agreed to tithe on the sale of the Trinity Towers buildings to Camp Wingmann. Since 2014, Holy Trinity Episcopal Church has sent **\$723,892 to Camp Wingmann.**

The church has **many outreach initiatives** every year, including filling 140 Christmas stockings with gift cards and in-kind donations for the children of Devereux. The church also provides two houses rent-free for Community of Hope, which provides transitional housing to homeless families.

A Few Words from Fr. Dave

The prophet Jeremiah wrote: *For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.* (Jeremiah 29:11 NRS).

Over the past two years this passage has been especially true for Tillie and me. Little did I know that after I retired, 1 May 2020 from St. Elizabeth's, I would have the opportunity of becoming the "Sabbatical Priest" at Holy Trinity for Rev. Pam and Fr. Steve. As we look ahead to the transition, Jeremiah's words could not be truer for me, you, and the family of Holy Trinity – *plans for our welfare and a future with hope*. I am truly blessed to be called here; I am blessed to work with Fr. Bob as the Associate Priest-in-Charge; I am blessed to work with a great Vestry and Staff; and I am blessed to being a part of God's plan serving you at HTC and being with you as long as it takes.

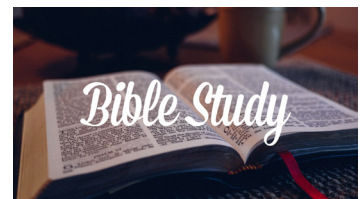
New and Renew!

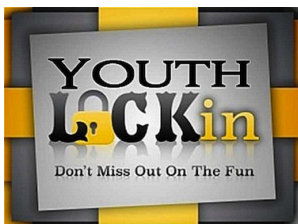
Children's Sunday School (age 3 - grade 6)
